





« Outdoor fire features come in all shapes, sizes, styles and and lifestyle. Nature's Outdoor Living specializes in galvanized steel frames, which are clad in a choice of stone or brick veneer that looks and feels like real stone, but without the weight.

The design possibilities for fireplaces and fire pits are many, says Biersteker.

"We can build a fire feature on any property it's the way we build them," he explains. "They are modular so we can adjust the size to fit any space. We can even build a fireplace on a deck using galvanized deck piles and stone veneer to minimize the weight. We can do a multitude of things to customize a fire feature. I have a fireplace that has a rock water feature on one side and a selfwatering planter on the other. You can even remove the chimney for a modern, linear look. Recently we just started making barn beam furniture and used old barn board to clad an outdoor gas fireplace for a really rustic look."

Antonio Salciccioli, owner of Rock Your World Landscaping in Milton has been creating landscaping plans and installing outdoor fireplaces and fire pits for more than seven years. He's a certified contractor/installer for Unilock in the GTA.

"Unilock interlocking stone pavers make the best fire pits because they are beautiful, easy to install and stand types and they can even be customized to suit your exterior decor up to the weather," states Salciccioli. "There are gas, propane or wood burning options, but my preference is a wood-burning fire pit because it gives off more heat and the Unilock system has an additional feature of a swing grill that can be used to cook, and then just swing it aside when you want to use it as a campfire. A fire pit makes a great conversation piece!" »

« Salciccioli cautions customers to check the local bylaws before installing a fire feature. "Every municipality seems to have their own rules in terms of recreational burning regulations. These include things like the distance a fire feature must be from a dwelling and the property line and whether or not a wood-burning feature is even allowed."

Seeing is believing, and if you want to see fire pits on display, stop by the Unilock Outdoor Idea Centre in Georgetown. The Idea Centre even offers free 3D drawings so customers can see what their dream backyard can look like.

Portable Fire Pits

Some portable fire pits have gone high tech, like the new BioLite Fire Pit which allows you to control the flame manually or remotely with the free Bluetooth app.

The revolutionary fire pit burns wood or charcoal with a capacity for up to four standard firewood logs. "Lift the fuel rack and toss in charcoal to transform it from a fire pit to a portable hibachi style grill, complete with an included grill."

Iron Embers, located in Orton, just west of Orangeville, creates beautiful steel fire pits, fire bowls and pyramid style fire places that look like works of art. Their artisan fire features are made of quarter-inch thick carbon steel that's coated with high heat enamel metal and then hand welded into various shapes such as the Octagon Fire Bowl, Pyramid Fireplace, The Modern Cube, Fire Rings and the new Chimnea pyramid-shaped fire place. The unique designs are created by three brothers: Eric, Ken and Adrian Tamminga.

"The real cool thing about our fire pits as opposed to masonry fireplaces is that our raised fire pits on legs give off radiant heat so you stay warm around the campfire, and this extends the season," says Adrian. "Our fire pits and bowls are designed for wood, but you can add charcoal on top of the wood for cooking and we sell accessories including cooking grates."
